#### Class Placements

In Rito and Māhuri Teams (both composite year level teams) we largely keep our learners within the same hubs. This allows for relationships that have already been established to strengthen.

#### Potential Return to School

As you will be aware, the Minister of Education has announced that schools may return in some capacity from the 15th of November. This is very much an indicative date and no further information has been shared by the Ministry of Education. It is likely that if this option was to go ahead that there may be staggered days for different students, but even this is an assumption. I am due to attend a zoom at the end of this week to meet with Auckland Principals along with Ministry representatives. Once a direction is made clear, I will share this with our school community. While we are eager to take the next step back towards 'typical' school, this must be done in a way that minimises the risk to our learners and our wider school whānau.

Please keep an eye out for a survey link that will be sent through today, to gauge how many of our families intend to send their children back to school if a reopening this term was to take place.
